

# A Campaign for the Future of the Cape Community Arena

### Overview of CCA

Cape Community Arena Group (CCAG) is a volunteer-run 501(c)3 non-profit that operates a seasonal open-air ice rink, the Cape Community Area (CCA) in Cape Elizabeth, Maine.

CCA began operations in the winters of 2021 and 2022 as a temporary, community-scale, back-yard style, unchilled rink behind Town Hall which hosted open skate and informal pick-up hockey - all free of charge. These first two winter seasons acted as a 'proof of concept' and there was overwhelming positive feedback from the community.





Working towards the goal of a permanent arena, CCAG engaged engineers, designers, and town officials to select a permanent site at Gull Crest, town-owned land containing sports fields and trails.

The inaugural season at Gull Crest in 2023 provided 430+ hours of ice time and had 150+ Cape Elizabeth youth participating in skating and hockey programs. The most

recent season (2024) offered an expanded set of programs & community events, including more than 650 hours of ice time, learn to skate and play programs, adult and youth hockey leagues, school practice and game time, and community events. Open/family skate continued to be offered for free. More than 100 volunteers and nearly 300 donors made rink operations possible.

## The Vision

We envision the CCA to be a four-season, multi-purpose covered arena that will provide safe, healthy, family-oriented skating experiences in the winter and host year-round, multigenerational activities in spring, summer and fall. It will be a community gathering place for recreation, socialization, and cultural activities. Once built, the arena will be donated to the Town of Cape Elizabeth to own and manage as a town amenity.





## The Challenge

While the rink and the skating programs have evolved and improved each year, one thing has remained constant: the rink is always dependent on the weather and the availability of our amazing volunteer network. This winter, the rink closed 26 times because of poor weather conditions and 2,000+ volunteer hours were spent on ice maintenance due to rainy, warm and/or snowy conditions. Adding a roof will mean that we



do not have to operate at the whim of mother nature and will also extend the skating season by an estimated 1-2 months, equivalent to adding 300+ hours of family/open skate and programs.

Over 100 volunteers have been the heart and soul of CCA since its inception. However, the amount of work it takes to keep the rink operational isn't sustainable without a roof to protect the ice from the elements. If we want this incredible community amenity available for years to come, we need to fund critical capital improvements now.

In addition to the absence of a roof, the lack of permanent changing rooms and viewing areas prevent the rink from being considered an attractive site to host revenue-generating tournaments, leagues, school practices/games. These amenities will mean the arena can be used year-round for activities like summer camps, fitness classes, pre-season training, events, and more. Lastly, a covered arena in town will also provide access to affordable, local ice time at a reasonable time of day to local hockey teams.

### The Plan

CCAG is embarking on a \$5 million dollar capital campaign to bring our vision to life. We will:

- Lay a permanent foundation: this will make maintaining the ice rink easier and allows for installing other types of flooring to support year-round activities.
- **Purchase a chiller:** the seasonal chiller rental is the rink's single largest expense to the tune of more than \$60,000 per season. Purchasing a chiller outright will cut that expense by more than half.
- **Build a roof:** this will maintain an open air feel while ensuring reliable skating time and extend the skating season.
- Add amenities that are necessary to make the rink usable and attractive for fee generating rentals: bathrooms, changing rooms, viewing room, concessions, etc. These amenities will be available to the community at Gull Crest year round.
- Fund the first five years of operations.






Preliminary architectural renderings. Design has not been finalized.

# Why Now?

The future of the Cape Community Arena is uncertain. The amount of volunteer work it takes to keep the rink operational isn't sustainable. A roof and other improvements will ensure that this incredible town amenity can continue to serve our community now and into the future.

The expected contributions to the population served by the rink go way beyond ice time. CCA exists as a community gathering place and safe recreational activity for people of all ages. With no teen center or free outdoor drop-in program for youths and teens in Cape Elizabeth or nearby, CCA gives young people a safe place for social interaction, connection to others, and opportunity for physical activity to support their health and well-being.

The rink benefits more than kids and teens. Last year, the US Surgeon General raised an alarm about the public health crisis of loneliness, isolation, and lack of connection in our country. The CCA is a place that brings people of all ages together and provides an opportunity for social interaction and recreation. The rink has even become a gathering spot for non-skaters, who volunteer their time as rink supervisors or come as spectators. If you have ever visited the rink, you know the magic it has brought to our community and beyond.

Adding a roof and permanent amenities to CCA is also critical to the long-term economic vitality of the arena. Additional rink rentals, tournaments, and learn to skate/play programs made possible by capital improvements will generate revenue that will make the rink self-sufficient and able to expand free open skate opportunities.

Bottom line: the rink is accessible, inclusive, used by people of all ages, encourages people to be active, and to connect with their community. We need to act to keep it that way.
